Submission to the ESCoE Occasional Paper Series should be made in **.pdf** format to **escoeinfo@niesr.ac.uk**. The e-mail accompanying the submitted paper should nominate a senior ESCoE researcher to give an opinion of its suitability for its inclusion in the ESCoE Occasional Paper Series in terms of topic, format and relevance; see <https://www.escoe.ac.uk/people/our-researchers/>. In the absence of the nomination of a suitable senior ESCoE researcher, the ESCoE Academic Co-Director may him/herself assess the suitability of a submission for the ESCoE Occasional Paper Series or may send the paper to an appropriate ESCoE associate to seek his/her recommendation.

All submissions to the ESCoE Occasional Paper Series are sent to the Office for National Statistics for possible comment.
